\_\_\_\_\_ **1) VOTER SERVICES ACTIVITIES** – Each year the Wake League conducts a variety of voter services projects including candidate surveys and forums as well as answering telephones and conducting recounts at the Wake County Board of Elections.

\_\_\_\_\_ **2) DEATH PENALTY MORATORIUM** – The Wake League has studied and adopted a position in support of a moratorium on the death penalty. The group works with state and local coalitions, which advocate for the moratorium.

\_\_\_\_\_ **3) ENVIRONMENT**– The Environment Committee studies, develops positions and takes action regarding air and water quality and sedimentation in conjunction with other local organizations. The committee meets monthly.

\_\_\_\_\_ **4) LOCAL SCHOOL POLICIES** – The Education Committee represents the League in support of adequate funding for the schools, the current school commitment to racial and economic diversity as well as a comprehensive sex education curriculum. The committee meets monthly during the school year.

\_\_\_\_\_ **5) IMMIGRATION ISSUES** – This research committee investigates local issues in tandem with the two-year study being undertaken by the LWV-US regarding immigration policies. The committee meets monthly.

\_\_\_\_\_ **6) AFFORDABLE HOUSING/FAIR HOUSING** – The Wake League supports more affordable housing and better access to housing for all our citizens. Members are kept informed about local issues.

\_\_\_\_\_ **7) WOMEN'S EQUALITY DAY (WED)** – The Wake League holds an annual celebration of the women in Wake County who serve in elective office. This is held on the anniversary of the passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment that gave women the right to vote. It is the major fund-raiser that supports League initiatives.

\_\_\_\_\_ **8) MEMBERSHIP** – The League conducts ongoing membership recruitment and orientation/social activities. This committee will be very active over the next year. Current members may assist with recruitment and/or volunteer as mentors for new members.

\_\_\_\_\_ **9) LWV-NC LOBBY CORPS** – The State League is seeking volunteers to help monitor and lobby at the General Assembly. Advocacy days are held periodically, usually in conjunction with like-minded organizations.

\_\_\_\_\_ **10) ONE-TIME PROJECTS** – During the year a number of League events require a single day (or a few hours) of commitment. These include generating questions for candidate forums and setting up for WED, the monthly Lunch with the League or general membership meetings.
