Alison Brown achieved international notoriety as a banjo player by pushing the instrument out of its familiar Appalachian setting and into new musical territory. After playing with Alison Krauss for several years she struck out on her own with four albums on the renowned Vanguard label and one on her own Compass Records. Now, more recently, she has

brought her banjo back to its bluegrass roots and to her own musical beginnings.

Alison has recorded six critically acclaimed solo albums, earned a Grammy nomination and has been featured on CBS Sunday Morning, NPR's All Things Considered, and the Wall Street Journal. Before she went professional, Allison was an investment banker, nuff said!
