Tim Harrison is perhaps Canada's finest singer-songwriter on the folk and acoustic landscape today. His poignant themes and vivid images reveal him to be a story-teller of our times - an archetypal traveler singing with compassion and hope. Hailing from Owen Sound, Ontario, and now living in Toronto, Tim made his debut in 1979 with the appearance of the much heralded 'Train Going East', produced by Stan Rogers. Since then he has recorded many albums all of which have garnered accolades at home and abroad. His are signature albums of stirring ballads influenced by tradition, yet all of which have Tim's inimitable stamp. Tim is a consummate artist whose performances are propelled by his powerful singing and poetic lyrics. He makes the 'everyday' extraordinary by his ability to reveal and describe our innermost thoughts and emotions while infusing sometimes dark experience with the light of optimism and hope. His concerts are punctuated with great story-telling and wit, making him an audience favorite.



Enthusiastic response has led to tours across Canada, the U.S. and the U.K., where Tim has performed everywhere from the Philadelphia Folk Festival to Scotland's An Lanntair Arts Centre and at dozens of other festivals. His commitment to traditional and contemporary folk music is also seen in his previous roles as artistic director of such events as the Summerfolk Music and Crafts Festival and of Mariposa - the highly acclaimed "urban" festival in Toronto. His artistic vision earned him respect across the country as one of Canada's foremost artistic directors. As songsmith, story-teller and performer, Tim is an inspiring artist whose appearance will delight you.
