John Dee Holeman was born in Orange County, North Carolina in 1929. He is a storyteller, dancer and a blues artist in the great tradition of Blind Boy Fuller. His vocal and guitar styles are part of the wonderful Piedmont and Texas, though his material is sometimes straight Chicago. His art has been recognized by both a National Endowment for the Arts National Heritage fellowship and a North Carolina Folk Heritage award. John Dee has toured the U.S, Europe and Asia. John Dee will be accompanied and assisted by Billy Stevens on harmonica and keyboard-precussion.
