Steve Riley and his Mamou Playboys are the reigning kings of what's been dubbed as "swamp pop." Born in the Creole town of Mamou, Louisiana, Riley was raised on Cajun music as a child and showed an early mastery of the style before being snapped up by Zydeco master Dewey Balfa at age 15. But in 1988, after only three years with Balfa, Riley was ripe to form the Mamou Playboys. Riley's band began to shake up tradition almost immediately. Since then he has been pleasing traditionalists while boldly pushing at the limits of Zydeco and increasing its audiences nationwide.
